WELCOME NOTE FROM GEORGE POLIZOS

The photo of my mother on the front cover was taken in early 1966 when I was a student at Virginia Beach Friends School. I remember those days clearly – walking to the Meeting house once a week to contemplate in complete silence for 30 minutes. What torture! I remember finishing math assignments well within the allotted time and working on even more, learning an important lesson that every child everywhere should learn: don't settle for the minimum. I began competing with myself to see how much I could accomplish. Finally, although I didn't realize it at the time, I was building a foundation based on the Quaker testimonies that we call SPICES (we like acronyms at Friends): simplicity, peace, integrity, community, equality, and stewardship. These character traits live in every child who goes through Friends and stays with them for life.



My mother passed away in February 2018, and the School Committee, of which I am now a member, made the decision to redesign our campus anchored by a new building. When the initial rendering called for an outside workspace adjacent to the art room, I sensed the perfect opportunity to honor my mother's talents and gifts by naming this beautiful space the Catherine Polizos Art Pavilion. My hope is that her ongoing presence will inspire budding artists to take their talents as far as they can.

WELCOME NOTE FROM LYNN POLIZOS

This is an image that I too will always remember – my mom sitting at her art table designing timeless corporate graphics, while I sat on the floor drawing my own creations.

After completing her degree at the Moore College of Art & Design in Philadelphia, Mom became a trailblazer in the local advertising industry, becoming one of the first female graphic artists in the 1960's Mad Men era. She earned many awards for her creative excellence and was a respected mentor to many young graphic artists during her 30-year career.


Mom was inspired and energized by her frequent visits to major art museums, many times with George and me in tow. She shared her love of art by teaching us how to read and appreciate the visual elements of art and design that bring artwork to life. But it was her love of painting that most fulfilled her throughout her life and well into her 80s. Her contemporary abstracts and collages among mediums of oils, watercolors and charcoal have a prominent place in our homes.

Mom would be overwhelmed with our gesture in honoring her with the Catherine Polizos Art Pavilion. Art gave her much joy throughout her life and she would be excited that a dedicated space named for her would inspire children to identify and expand their talent, gifts and creativity.

No wonder Cathy Polizos has such an unusual interest in art--Art's her husband and profession.

She's a prize-winning advertising artist who works with her husband, Art Polizos in his ad agency. She has, in fact won four awards in as many years- the most recent from the Art Director's Club at Norfolk for a trademark design of a new Richmond bank.

"I had a free hand in designing this," she said holding up the bank symbol, "I selected the colors and just about all the designs, and it was very satisfying to do."

Cathy is a design artist as opposed to an illustrative one. She is a graduate of the Moore Institute of Art in Philadelphia. Her artist's life is geared to a wide range of symbols and letterheads.

She has no difficulty adjusting her career to her home life.

"I have the same kind of set up at home as I have here in the office," she said. "I can do a great deal of work at home if I have to."

She and Art live in Pembroke Manor with their two children, George, 7, and Lynn, 4. When George knew I was going to be interviewed this morning, he asked if I were going to be in the funny papers."



Cathy loves to cook. "I have drawers filled with fancy recipes, but I can't find the time to do all the things I want." Cathy's busy life doesn't leave much time for hobbies, but she's looking forward to more leisure in the future. "I have a file at home where I put all the patterns, projects and things I want to eventually get around to," she said. "I call it my, 'someday file."

She feels that working sometimes helps family life because the children are more aware of outside interests. But we have a rule at home-never discuss advertising after hours," she said.

Cathy Polizos is sold on the field of commercial art for women. She thinks more and more opportunities are opening for them if they have a flair and can get a feeling across.

Cathy's artistic flair shows in her choice of clothes. A subtle yellow silk blouse was a delightful compliment to the green tweedy suit she was wearing. Explaining her fashion perception, she said, "An artist looks at things differently. Colors are related in a different perspective."


